Aluminium Can and Foil Collection

As you are aware, St Mary's is aiming to meet government targets to become a 'greener' school.

In order to do so we have started to recycle paper, card, plastic, aluminium cans and tin foil. You can help us by sending in unwanted aluminium cans and foil as we are able to sell this for a small profit to school funds. This money will then be spent on sustainable development resources in school.

Collection points are outside the school office.

Rag Bag Textile Collection

Some of you may have noticed the large textile collecting box outside the school office.

We have now forged links with a company in Scotland to collect our textiles. So far, with your help we have raised $\pounds 70$ for school funds.

You can send your unwanted textiles in at any time. This includes unwanted, clean clothing, bed linen, shoes (tied together), blankets, towels, curtains, handbags and belts. Plastic bags are available from the school office should you require one

Jewellery Recycling Week

Your child should have returned home with a plastic envelope for our jewellery recycling week.

If you, or any friends or relatives have any unwanted or broken jewellery please send into school by Friday 5th March.

We are collecting gold, silver, costume jewellery and watches and there will be a prize draw for one lucky envelope returned.
