#### Principal: Ms O. O'Beirne

At the morning Mass at Casa Santa Marta, Pope Francis spoke about the importance of recognising that we are sinners, and knowing the love of Jesus Christ. He asked: Who is Jesus Christ for you? And explained that if someone asks us the question, "Who is Jesus Christ?", we should say what we have learned: He is the Saviour of the world, the Son of the Father, which we recite in the Creed. But, the Pope said, it is a little more difficult to answer the question of who Jesus Christ is "for me." It is a question that can embarrass us a little bit, because in order to answer that question, "I have to dig into my heart"; that is, we have to begin from our own experience. Pope Francis explained: "The first step is knowing oneself: [that we are] sinners. Without this understanding, and without this interior confession – that I am a sinner – we cannot go forward. The second step is prayer to the Lord, who with His power makes us know this mystery of Jesus, which is the fire that He has brought upon the earth. It would be a good habit if every day, in every moment, we could say, "Lord, let me know You, and know myself."

On Thursday 18<sup>th</sup> October, Year 4 were lucky to have the West Midlands Fire Service come into school to discuss the importance of fire and road safety.

The children were all shocked to see how quickly a fire can spread. They were taught where the best place to put a smoke alarm

was and also how they could escape a building if it was on fire. The children answered the question the Fire Service asked and also asked important questions about fire safety. The Fire Service also explained the importance of not making hoax phone calls to the emergency services and gave the children an example of what could happen.

The Fire Service then spoke to the children about the importance of road safety and also how to be safe in a car. The children had a game to play where they had to find the correct actions and the incorrect actions, this was enjoyed by all.

Year 4, enjoyed the visit from the Fire Service and learned lots of important facts!

#### Admissions

Is your child starting primary school or secondary school in September 2019?

Children starting secondary school in September 2019, need to submit applications by no later than 31st October 2018.

If your child is starting primary school in September 2019 you will need to apply for a place by no later than 15th January 2019



#### Inhalers, Epipens and Medication:

If your child has an inhaler or epipen please make sure that it is labelled and that the use by date will last for the whole term.

If your child needs to take medication whilst at school, please complete a form available from the school office. Only prescribed medication will be administered.

All medication must be provided in the original pharmacists' packaging or container with your child's name, dosage and date clearly visible.

#### **ATTENDANCE**

As a school we have a duty to monitor all pupils' attendance. As you know, good attendance is very important to us here at St Mary's and we are working hard to make sure that all children attend school as often as possible. We understand that children cannot help being ill, but we would urge parents to do their best to ensure that medical and dental appointments are made for outside of school hours. Below is a table showing how time off affects our child's learning.
