### School Information and Procedures

This week we have sent out Student Update Forms so that you can let us know about any changes of address or telephone numbers. It is <u>very</u> important to make sure that contact information is <u>kept up to date</u>



in case we need to contact you urgently. Please return this form as soon as possible, even if there are no changes to be made. In this way, we can be certain that we have the most up-to-date information from you. If any details change during the year, please let us know as soon as possible so that we can update our records. We will also be sending consent forms for offsite visits, internet use, photograph use etc. Please return these to school as soon as possible to ensure your child does not miss out on any activities. An annual medical update form for Reception - Year 6 is also being sent out. Please return this as soon as possible, even if your child has no medical conditions (just write N/A). If your

child has an inhaler please make sure it is back in school after the holiday and that the 'use by date' will last for the whole term. May I also remind you that First Aiders may only give prescribed medicines if parents complete a school consent form. Please complete and return your home - school agreement as soon as possible.

### Photo consent forms

Each year we require an update on permission to use your child's photograph in a variety of settings. This includes classroom and corridor displays in school, on our monthly newsletters, and on our school website. It is lovely for us to be able to share children's achievements and the exciting activities that they have taken part in, but we cannot use these photographs unless we have your permission. It is possible to give permission for some things, eg in school, but not in others, eg, on the internet. We will never publish a child's full name with a photograph for safeguarding reasons. If we do not have the form returned then we cannot assume that we have your permission.

## Parents Code of Conduct



At St Mary's we believe that staff, parents and children are entitled to a safe and protective environment in which to work and learn. Behaviour that will cause harassment, alarm or distress to any users of the premises is contrary to the aims of our school. This is so we can continue to flourish, progress and achieve in an atmosphere of mutual understanding.

Any behaviour that is deemed unacceptable may result in the Police being informed.

The school reserves the right to take any necessary actions to ensure that members of the school community are not subjected to abuse. School premises are private property and parents have been granted permission from the school to be on school premises. However, in cases of abuse or threats to staff, pupils or other parents, school may ban parents from entering school.

## Keep in touch





We try our best to prevent any problems from arising but inevitably things can and do go wrong from time to time. If something goes wrong, if there is a problem or if you or your child are unhappy for any reason it is vital you let us know straight away. No problem is too small and the quicker we know about things the quicker we can sort them out.

If there are any problems or concerns that parents/ careers would like to discuss with a class teacher, staff are more than willing to meet you **after school by appointment**. Mornings are not really suitable for meetings without prior notice as staff are preparing for the

school day and once the bell rings, their priority is the children. Urgent messages may, of course, be left with the office staff or SLT on the gate that morning.

If you receive certain benefits you are eligible for free school meals. Even if you do not wish to take up the free meal (your child can still bring sandwiches!) - If you fill in the form and confirm your eligibility the school will receive additional funding called 'pupil premium'. We spend all of this money on improving provision for the children. Year Six pupils and their families will shortly be asked to express their preference for Secondary School places for next September. Information for this will be sent through the post from Dudley. I would strongly advise all families to go to look around schools that they are considering for next year. Hagley RC will be holding an open day on Saturday 14th October from 9:00am until 12:00 noon. Bishop Milner have open mornings on Friday 29th September between 10:30 and 11:30am; Monday 2nd October between 9:30 and 10:30; and Tuesday 3rd October between 10:30 and 11:30. These need to be pre-booked by calling the school on 01384 889422. Thorns Community College will be holding an open evening on Thursday 28th September from 6:00pm to 9:00pm. They also have open mornings from 9:00—11:00am on October 3rd, 4th and 6th.

### School Building Fund

In Catholic schools there is a legal liability to pay 10% of the cost of external buildings and maintenance work. To ensure that we are able to meet this legal liability, (which will ensure that our schools are properly maintained and necessary building work is undertaken), we invite parents



to make a voluntary contribution of £5 per child per half-term or where more than one child attends St Mary's School, £7.50 per half-term, (there are six half-terms in the school year). This equates to 58p per child per week.

All monies raised are used exclusively for St. Mary's School. The money does not go into a large fund for the Archdiocese, so St. Mary's benefits directly from the monies which are raised. For each £1.00 we raise for the School Building Fund, the Government will give us £9.00 for St. Mary's. Therefore, every £1.00 that is donated has tremendous buying power to improve our school for your children and, as you can see, no donation is too small. If you are worried that you may not be able to afford the contributions to the fund, please give what you can.

We can now accept payments for the School Building Fund by direct payment from your bank. The Standing Order Authority form can be found on our new school website along with a Gift Aid form which allows us to claim the tax paid on any donations.
