Jesus once again facilitated a miraculous catch of fish and shared breakfast with His disciples. At the end of breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Look after my sheep." Jesus was calling Simon Peter to return to the mission He had planned for Him.

We have learnt that Jesus has entrusted us with this mission too! We are called to love and respect one another, to spread the good news and demonstrate Christlike values in both the big and small facets of life.

### **Academy Committee Representatives**

We have an exciting opportunity for you to get involved in the life of St Mary's Catholic Primary School.

There is currently one vacancy for a Parent Representative. Therefore, you are invited to take part in the election of this role. The Articles of Association and Scheme of Delegation requires that the Academy Committee must include two parent Academy Committee members who have been elected by the parents/carers of registered students of the school and who themselves are parents/carers of registered students of the school at the time of their election. However, any parent who is an elected member of the local authority or employed to work at the school for more than 500 hours in any twelve consecutive months is not eligible to be a Parent Academy Committee Member.

The position consists of serving on the Academy Committee for four years. Nomination forms are available from the school website or office and must be returned to the school no later than 12 noon on Monday 20th June 2019. Should one nomination be received by the official closing date, the candidate will be duly elected unopposed. In the event of there being two or more nominations, an election will take place on Friday 25th June 2019. Information on voting arrangements will be sent to you at a later date.

Please note that you should not participate in more nominations than there are vacancies. Each nomination requires two proposers.

The Academy Committee is also looking to fill the vacancies for the role of Foundation Academy Representative.

The term for this role is also four years. **Academy Foundation Representatives must be Catholic** and are appointed to the position of Academy Foundation Representative by the Director of Education of the Diocesan Education Service, on behalf of the Archbishop and Trustees of the Archdiocese of Birmingham.

# **Contribution to School Funds**

Thank you to the small number of parents who have generously contributed to school funds either through a one off donation or have signed up to a monthly payment scheme. In addition, if you have any concerns about your child's learning, progress or emotional health and well-being our SENDCO, Miss Mosley, is here most Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays and can offer a range of help and support as well as arranging appointments wherever necessary. If you feel you need any help or support just let us know – come and see Ms O' Beirne or Mrs Borriello and we will do our best to arrange the best support we can.

#### **Polite Reminder**

Please be reminded that when we release your child to you at the end of the school day, they immediately become your responsibility. Please do not allow your child to run off onto the field or out of the playground unaccompanied.

# Please help us to maintain a quiet and respectful atmosphere at assembly and Mass

Please can we ask you to support the children and the staff by keeping assembly and Mass as a quiet and special time? Please avoid talking and using mobile phones and please supervise little ones as much as possible. We obviously don't expect babies and toddlers to be silent all of the time but please feel free to take your little one out into the main entrance area to settle them down if need be. Everyone of every age is always welcome for assembly and Mass but we do need to make sure it is a quiet and respectful time where all of the children and adults can concentrate and listen without being distracted.
