Did you know?

(useful energy saving tips)



- Less than 2% of the world's water supply is fresh water.
- Taking showers rather than baths would save enough water every week to make
 1,000 cups of tea.
- A garden sprinkler uses as much water in half an hour as a family of four in a day.
- In slow moving traffic, pollution levels are higher inside cars than outside. Try walking or cycling on journeys of less than 2 miles.
- Cycling or walking briskly for half an hour a day can halve the risk of heart disease.
- By simply turning the tap off while brushing your teeth you could save 6 litres of water a minute.
- Recycling just one aluminium can saves enough energy to run a television set for three hours.
- Switch off appliances when not in use to save £30 per year. Leaving unused appliances on standby (which means they're still using energy) costs around £800 million a year in the UK alone.
- Only boiling as much water as you need could save you up to £25 a year (based on five kettles a day, boiling one litre more than necessary).
