Welcome back to the Summer term which is the last term of the school year. The school year is going by very quickly!



# Aluminium Can and Foil Collection

As you are aware, St Mary's is aiming to meet government targets to become a 'greener' school.

In order to do so we have started to recycle paper, card, plastic, aluminium cans and tin foil. You can help us by sending in unwanted aluminium cans and foil as we are able to sell this for a small profit to school funds. This money will then be spent on sustainable development resources in school.

#### Rag Bag Textile Collection

Some of you may have noticed the large textile collecting box outside the school office.

We have now forged links with a company in Scotland to collect our textiles. So far, with your help we have raised £107 for school funds.

You can send your unwanted textiles in at any time. This includes unwanted, clean clothing, bed linen, shoes (tied together), blankets, towels, curtains, handbags and belts. Plastic bags are available from the school office should you require one



The Eco-Warriors have planted some courgettes, mixed salad leaves and tomatoes in our raised beds. We have used the water in the water butts to water our plants.

The Eco-Warriors have been working really hard towards earning the Green Flag at our school. We have planted different plants, recycled, tided up the field and much more.
