



The Archdiocese-advised scheme for RHE, "Life to the Full" is produced by a company called Ten Ten resources, and has been created in line with DfE statutory requirements, in keeping with the teachings of the Catholic Church. Ten Ten states:

"In creating this programme, we have tried to pitch the resources at an age-appropriate level for children within each learning stage. However, the final decision on when sessions should be taught are ultimately the responsibility of the school. At times, school may feel that children should be a little older for some sessions; at other times, school might feel that certain topics should be introduced sooner."

Please see below for school's decision on the Key Decisions during this academic year, based on results from consultation with all stakeholders, including parents. As cohorts differ, these decisions may change year on year, but school will inform parents if this is the case.
